On Sunday, March 24th, the 14th of Adar, we celebrated the festive holiday of Purim. Rabbi Assessor Adrian Schell led services, reading from our beautiful scroll, the Megillah Esther in Hebrew, as the congregants read responsively in German, Russian or English. We thank Rabbi Shillor for both the scroll of Esther and the tri-lingual Purim service booklets. The graggers sounded as we retold the Purim story. Many came in costume, and everyone enjoyed the delicious homemade Hamantaschen baked by Polina's Hamantaschen bakers. The sweet three-cornered cakes were filled with poppy seed, jam and lots of love.

Before services began, Adrian met with our Netzer group and prepared Schlachmones, baskets of food traditionally shared at Purim, for those who are ill or homebound. Activities such as these teach our youngsters Jewish values while having fun.

Our holiday celebration ended with a lively concert excellently performed by the Duo Elena Kondraschowa & Stella Perevalova from Hannover.



Our synagogue's second birthday was celebrated on Wednesday, February 20th. Polina Pelts gave a short history of our congregation while Rachel spoke about music's important role in Judaism. We welcomed members of the congregation and members of our foundation to a lovely concert performed by our very own Faina Pelts. Faina's voice has sweetened many Shabbat services over the past years, and so it was fitting that she began the birthday concert with songs of prayer. Her program included several Israeli pieces as well as Russian melodies familiar to many of our members. The afternoon quickly turned into a sing-along concert, enjoyed by all. Faina was thanked with hearty applause and a colorful bouquet. We congratulated ourselves after the concert with a bubbly glass of champagne before heading home with a song in our heart and the realization that our new synagogue is a small and wonderful miracle of faith. Hanukkah in March?

Anyone who enters our synagogue is awestruck by the beautiful silver Hanukkia on our Bimah. It doesn't belong to us (yet), but we hope with everyone's help to change that. Mr. Specht of Hamelin bought the Hanukkia years ago and has offered it to us for 400 Euros (about \$530). The Hannukia was beautifully handcrafted over 100 years ago in Portugal. Dolphins grace the foot, and each movable branch is adorned with blossoms and leaves, held by a hand and can be removed. Help us insure that the Hannukia will become a permanent part of our synagogue.
