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The wintry month of February’s cold winds, chilly temperatures and snow flurries were held at bay as spring sprung in our sanctuary, and members greeted one another for the happy holiday of Tu BiShevat. The table was laden with the prescribed first fruits, nuts, seeds, wine and juices needed for the Seder, led by Peter Benjamin Wendt. The holiday speaks to our feelings of solidarity with Israel, where the first blossoms and fruits awaken from their winter’s sleep. Our emotional connection to Israel is strong, and it seemed more than fitting in light of the recent political situation and was especially poignant to lift our voices in the singing of “Hatikvah” at the Seder’s conclusion. The holiday also emphasizes our feelings of Tikkun Olam and our responsibility as Jews and citizens to protect and care for our environment. We wish to thank the kitchen team for ushering spring and Tu BiShevat into our synagogue so beautifully.

Our congregation celebrated our building’s 4th birthday over the weekend of February 20th and 21st. We never cease to be amazed at the miracle of the rebirth of Jewish life in Hamelin, crowned with our beautiful synagogue. Our rooms buzz with activity day by day. Members come and go, greeting friends and neighbors at services and catching up on family news at Kiddush, hearing lectures, meeting for classes and groups, borrowing books from the library, receiving help from the office and encountering visitors wishing to learn more about Reform Judaism. Rabbi Irit Shillor led us through the weekend’s festivities and had these remarks during her Friday night sermon:

Our synagogue was dedicated four years ago. “Beitenu—Our House” is a holy space in which we can encounter God. In our synagogue, here and now, we can encounter God’s presence in us. This space was created to encourage God’s presence to dwell among us, but also for each and every one of us. God lives with us and so also in us. We sang this evening about the Shabbat angels and when we open the door symbolically at the conclusion of the song, “Lecha Dodi,” we imagine the presence of the “Shechina,” which if we allow, enter our hearts and souls and gives us strength. With intention, we attempt to reach a level of holiness through our prayers, meditations and deeds and create change in our world as this “Mishkan” evolves to a “Mikdash”—a holy space. May we all take this holiness with us when we go out and when we come in, when we lie down and when we rise up, and may we channel it into the world.





As Shabbat ended on Saturday, our musical groups presented an impressive concert. Performing were the groups “Benkshaft,” “Schalom” and “Melody,” Every seat was taken and everyone was in awe of the wide spectrum of musical talent in our congregation. It was of note that several of the musicians and singers took part in more than one ensemble. In good Jewish tradition, the pieces offered a menu of both joyous and melancholic music. The performers were thanked with rousing applause and bouquets of spring flowers. We thank all our wonderful musicians for this gala concert in honor of our 4th birthday. Rabbi Shillor dimmed the lights and a sweet hush filled the sanctuary as she led the Havdallah ceremony. Walking home in the chilly night air, filled with gratitude, the first star could be seen in the evening sky.

Our congregation wishes to thank everyone who has helped and supported us since the establishment of our congregation in 1996. Our congregation and our new synagogue are a vital and integral part of the Hamelin community.

We were happy to introduce Borys Utchitel as a full member of our congregation during Friday night services. Rabbi Shillor’s instruction prepared him well for his appointment with the Bet Din in Berlin. Congratulating him afterwards at Kiddush, board member Peter Benjamin Wendt said, “Dear Borys, it feels as if we have all received an additional birthday present through you. We honor your effort and welcome you into our Jewish family and community. May you be a blessing to your people.”
