



Dear members, friends and supporters,

The congregation is very grateful for any and all donations that enable us to continue our work.

The sunny month of June has arrived, and we hope to enjoy many warm moments inside and outside our synagogue walls.

Once again our synagogue drew Jews from near and far to our doors. Holocaust survivor Mrs. Margit Siebner was in Hameln speaking to the students of a local high school. After her lecture, she was presented with roses, one from each student. She asked the young people to accompany her to our building and she left two large vases of flowers at the memorial. This act was important and symbolic of her work of healing the scars of the Holocaust.

On a May Shabbat morning, we had a visitor from Bochum who was traveling through Hamelin. How good it is to see our synagogue welcome those seeking a Jewish space when in town.

Now let's take a closer look back at what went on during the past weeks.

Polina Pelts organizes the monthly get-togethers, which address the needs of our older congregants thanks to a project sponsored by "**Aktion Mensch**." An outing was organized at the end of April, and 26 members went on an excursion to Cologne and Bonn. Polina's hard work bore fruit, and our seniors enjoyed a day tailored to their needs, which would have been otherwise impossible for them. Besides their many physical handicaps, most of our seniors live on a fixed budget, and outings are usually beyond their financial reach. Enjoy Polina's report of the day:

"Our group met at the train station bright and early. Everyone found a comfortable seat in the bus and after a short greeting, we were off. The day-long trip made us feel as if we were a big Jewish family—the air filled with happy chatter and sharing of tasty foods prepared and brought from home. All our aches, pains and worries were forgotten for the day. Everyone was in a happy mood. We had the good luck to have an excellent tour guide with us who added to our appreciation of the cities we toured. It was such a wonderful day and a special treat for our seniors. Hopefully, we can arrange similar outings in the future and say thank you to "Aktion Mensch" for brightening the lives of those who have seen little pleasure in their lives."

We had the rare opportunity to celebrate **Shabbat** and **May 9th Memorial Day** together this year. Rabbi Adrian explained that we could honor the Sabbath and remember the brave soldiers who fought to end World War II. Rabbi Adrian's moving and poignant sermon addressed both. We, as many Jewish communities in Germany did, found it possible and important to observe the Shabbat and Memorial Day together. The prayers and songs, the readings and poems all added special meaning to the day. The entire congregation was invested and actively involved. Our congregation is unusual in that so many of our members are so talented. On this special Shabbat all these talents were showcased. Neil Yerman, a gifted sofer, artist and scholar, enabled his listeners to learn, question and watch him as he worked at this ancient and holy task. Explaining complicated spiritual concepts comes easy to this talented and charming man. The audience was invited to examine his tools and to gaze upon the scroll as he worked. We hope to host Sofer Yerman again soon and have the opportunity to experience the living Torah.

Lag B'Omer was celebrated with a congregational picnic on Sunday, May 18th. We were once again guests of our neighbors, the Reformed Lutheran church, and held our picnic in their beautiful garden. Everyone brought a covered dish to share, more than 70 kosher hot dogs sizzled over the fire, and the relaxing atmosphere was enjoyed by the one-year olds as well as the ninety-one year olds!
